Luke 15:11-13: The Father's Love

- God does not force His will upon us
- God lavishes blessings upon us
- God allows us to follow our desires
- God allows us to leave Him



- Ezekiel 33:10-11 Why will you die?
- Galatians 1:3-5 According to God's will
- 1 Thessalonians 4:1-7 Sanctification
- 2 Peter 3:9 Repentance
- Romans 5:8 and John 3:16 Christ's sacrifice for us

- The world gladly takes all that one has
- The world's pleasure are brief
- The world gives nothing in return
- The world enslaves those found within
- The world does not care about individuals



- John 8:34 Slaves to sin
- 2 Peter 2:19–21 Slaves of corruption
- Ephesians 2:11-12 In the world, without God
- Ephesians 4:17-19 Walk as the world

- Romans 1:20-32 God gave them over...
  - v. 24 To impurity
  - v. 26 To degrading passions
  - v. 28 To a depraved mind
